For children all over the world a birthday party is something that everybody looks forward to with eager anticipation. In most cultures birthdays are associated with presents, with something special to eat and with much fun and laughter.

Today's party comes at a time when our annual 16 Days of Activism campaign is drawing to a close. This global campaign draws the public attention towards the issue of violence that are directed against women and children.

As a responsible and caring City, we cannot sit back with folded arms while so many young children find themselves on the streets begging for a living, vulnerable to crime and unable

to receive decent food and shelter.

To those children we would like to take this opportunity to say that in the City of Johannesburg we love you, we care about you, we are concerned about your situation and we are determined to do everything possible to improve the quality of your lives.

Those who are familiar with the issues will agree with me that this is formidable challenge. To succeed, we need a partnership. At this special time of the year when most of the major religions and communities are celebrating the festive season, we are calling upon all stakeholders: the social workers, NGOs, civil society organisations, volunteers and all others to join us in addressing this complex challenge.

Programme Director, I would like to urge the private sector to get involved in such initiative at a much larger scale than is currently the case. Quite often, companies are looking for opportunities to direct their corporate social investment spending and I think that they should explore support for initiatives dealing with neglected children and women.

Today – we are celebrating your birthday. Happy Birthday!!!

To the one thousand children who are celebrating this birthday with us today, I would like to emphasise once again that:

- the City of Johannesburg love you and care about you.
- You have a right to be treated with respect, dignity and love.
- It is our responsibility to protect you, to ensure that you are not neglected and
- To also ensure that you grow up into responsible and caring adults and citizens.

As government and as society at large we must be inspired by this event to dedicate ourselves to the protection of our young children – and all other vulnerable individuals – to ensure that the fruit of a better life is shared by all.
