However, it was the power of sport, and the power of football that made everyone in this very stadium to shout Jomo! Who will forget our historic victories against Argentina in 1976, another triumph by the black XI against the British XI also in the 70's here at the Rand Stadium, as well as the 1996 AFCON victory at the FNB Stadium.

Programme Director, I must acknowledge that this Football Coaches Symposium, held under the banner *A Nation in Search of its Soul – a Dawn of a Coaching Revolution* will breathe fresh air into our football.
