

DISCRETIONARY GRANT APPLICATIONS FIRST FUNDING WINDOW INVITATION FOR 2023/24 and 2024/2025

Opening Date of Funding Window: 8 October 2023 Closing Date of Funding Window: 8 November 2023

The Local Government Sector Education and Training Authority (LGSETA) invites local government stakeholders to apply for the Discretionary Grants Funding Window in support of the LGSETA Strategic Plan and Annual Performance Plan targets.

The Discretionary Grant is aimed at addressing the national priorities as set out in the National Skills Development Plan (NSDP, 2030), the Sector Priority Occupations and Interventions (SPOI) List, Occupational Shortages (scarce skills) and Skills Gaps (top-up or critical skills) aligned to the strategic focus areas of the Local Government Sector Education and Training Authority.

The Discretionary Grant applications must be for training aimed at addressing the above areas and be informed by the LGSETA's skills development priorities in response to the Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Plan (ERRP), Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Skills Strategy (ERRSS), LGSETA Discretionary Grant Strategic Priority Areas, District Development Model (DDM) and the Strategic Partnership Model.

How to apply?

- 1. Levy-Paying institutions and all stakeholders as outlined in the table above, are invited to apply by sending only one application using the proposal template as provided by the LGSETA. (see proposal template in the LGSETA Website).
- 2. The applications must be aligned to LGSETA key focus areas, Economic Reconstruction and Recovery Skills Strategy (ERRSS), District Development Model (DDM) and the skills levels applied for must be in line with the LGSETA Sector Skills Plan including the Sector Priority Occupations and Interventions and Skills Gaps.

Submissions:

- 1. The Discretionary Grant applications for the listed learning programmes must be submitted **online only** to the email address <u>dgapplications@lgseta.org.za</u> (No applications should be sent to personal email addresses or hand delivered).
- 2. The application window opens on 8 October 2023 at 8:00 am and closes on the 8 November 2023 at 23:59 (midnight). The deadline will not be extended. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered.
- 3. Stakeholders are expected to send **ONLY ONE** proposal for the learning interventions applied per institution using the proposal template. Multiple applications won't be considered.
- 4. Compulsory briefing sessions will be conducted virtually to take applicants through the process. (See LGSETA website for more information).

- 1. All the Discretionary Grant applications are subject to approval by the LGSETA Accounting Authority.
